Mission Statement

Young Texans Against Cancer is an independent, nonprofit organization comprised of young men and women who have either lost or witnessed a loved one fighting cancer or are seeking to become more actively involved in the cancer community. Our organization is focused on raising funds for local research and support organizations, using our member base to increase awareness of volunteer organizations and helping to educate our community on cancer research.

A Message from YTAC's Founder

In 2001 when I began to search for an outlet to be proactive in the fight against cancer, I explored several options but none seemed to offer the kind of involvement I was looking for. There are hundreds of groups and organizations that benefit cancer, but I found very few that harness the energy and desire of young people who want to do more than volunteer a few hours or write a check. Young Texans Against Cancer is designed to reach out to young people who want to be more active in fighting all kinds of cancers. There are obvious limitations to targeting young people in terms of time and resources, but YTAC is set up to be more of a grassroots organization whose success depends on size and motivation. We offer three core outlets for people to participate: social events, volunteer/awareness opportunities and financial support. Our donors and sponsors are made up of young professionals across Texas who become members or attend YTAC events, corporations, foundations and family trusts.

YTAC is run 100% by its members, who are committed to raising money and awareness to fight the many kinds of cancer that have affected their loved ones. This principal is what sets YTAC apart from so many other organizations, the members drive participation and determine which charities they wish to allocate volunteer hours and funds. Unlike other young professional outlets, YTAC has no overriding affiliation dictating our budget nor preselecting where our funds go.

As we reflect on our first ten years, I couldn't be more proud of our efforts and execution. Our accomplishments on an individual basis are too great to count as we have touched the lives of thousands of people across the state. Over our ten year span we produced over 17,000 hours of volunteer works, raised over \$1,000,000 dollars and created an outlet for young people across Texas to get involved.

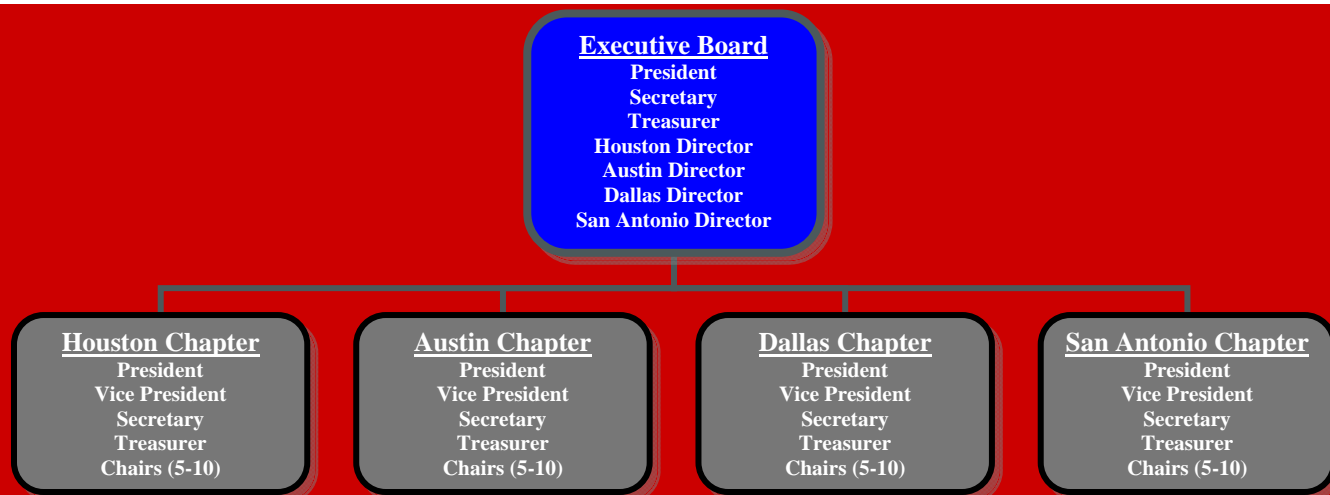
A Message from YTAC's President

YOUNG TEXANS AGAINST CANCER EXECUTIVE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Young Texans Against Cancer is governed by a 7 member Executive Board comprised of current and former chapter leaders from around the state. The Executive Board provides oversight to chapter boards, compliance of YTAC's Mission Statement and 501(c)(3) status, coordination and submittals of annual tax returns, implementation of risk management and growth strategies.



Matthew Gordon | President, 2011-2013

Matthew Gordon served on the Houston Chapter Board of Directors from 2006-2010 in different positions, including President. In 2010, Matt was elected to create the YTAC Executive Board and named President commencing January 2011. 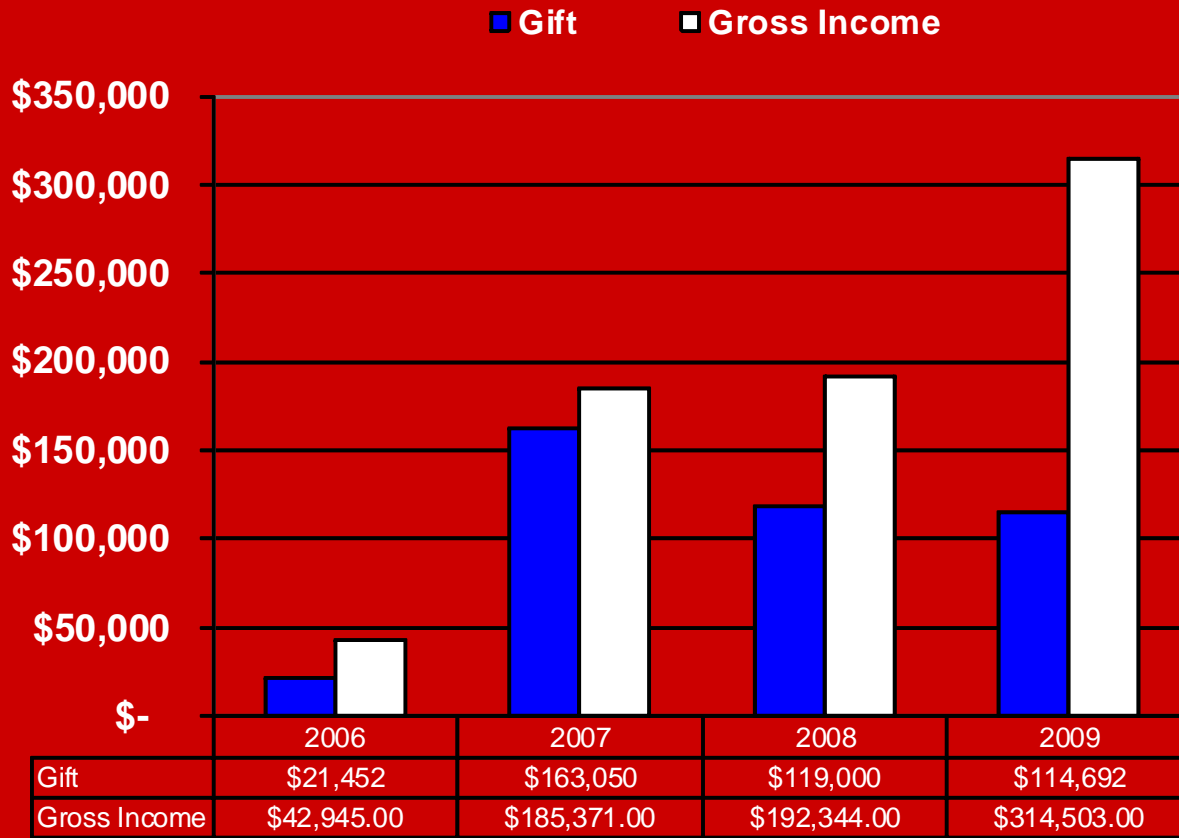
Brent Conger | Director

CUMMULATIVE INCOME & DONATIONS BY YEAR

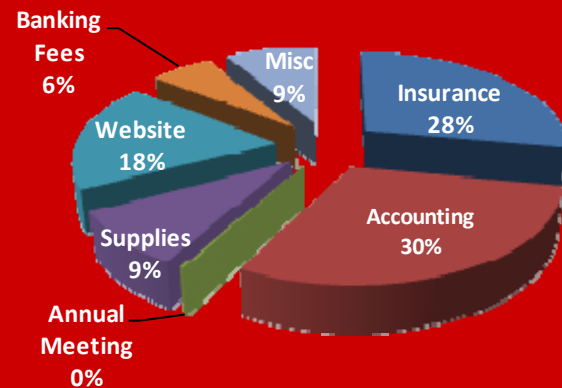


ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES

Young Texans Against Cancer is a strictly volunteer organization which prides itself on low administrative costs. YTAC does not have any employees nor does it rent office space, instead leaders donate their time and meetings are held at locations which require no costs. YTAC's policy is to keep administrative costs and overhead under 5% of gross annual income. All expenses related to events are paid for by the revenues of the specific event.

YTAC OPERATES UNDER THE FOLLOWING POLICIES...

Organization & Board Member Practices Policy

- ◆ Board Members shall act in the best interest of Young Texans Against Cancer and not the interests of one's self or the interests of any other person or entity.
- ◆ Board Members shall avoid any conflicts of interest that may be detrimental to Young Texans Against Cancer. Board Members shall disclose all employment and non-profit interests, major interests/ownership in corporations and commitments to the Board of Directors. If the Board of Directors feels at any time that a Board Member has created a conflict of interest, that member shall be removed from the Board immediately.
- ◆ Board Members shall not accept compensation from Young Texans Against Cancer.
- ◆ All fundraising information, materials and strategies must be truthful and accurate.
- ◆ All minutes, meetings and actions shall be documented accurately, approved in a timely manner and retained by the Board of Directors.
- ◆ The Board of Directors shall act morally, ethically and for the good of Young Texans Against Cancer.
- ◆ No individual of the organization shall be permitted to be the sole signor on any Young Texans Against Cancer financial accounts.
- ◆ Check writing duties shall be permitted by a Director separate from the Director assigned book keeping duties.
- ◆ Financial reports shall be presented to the Chapter Board of Directors monthly for review.
- ◆ Young Texans Against Cancer shall not loan any money to any entity, person or organization.
- ◆ Young Texans Against Cancer shall not exceed administrative and overhead costs of more than 5% of annual revenues.
- ◆ Events hosted and coordinated by Young Texans Against Cancer which serve alcohol shall require event insurance.
- ◆ At all times, Young Texans Against Cancer shall possess Directors and Officer's Insurance.

Effectiveness Policy

Annually the Executive Board shall administer an Effectiveness Review of Young Texans Against Cancer. The purpose of the review shall be to measure Young Texans Against Cancer's effectiveness by assuring compliance of the Mission Statement as well as measuring growth in membership, revenues, community involvement and gifts. Upon completion of the Effectiveness Review, the YTAC Executive Board shall issue a statement summarizing the organization's effectiveness and, if necessary, create a strategic plan for improvement.

Privacy Policy

In order to fulfill its mission, Young Texans Against Cancer maintains databases that are compiled exclusively of information knowingly and voluntarily provided to Young Texans Against Cancer by our donors, members and Web site visitors. Young Texans Against Cancer respects the privacy of our donors, members and Web site visitors. Please note Young Texans Against Cancer reserves the right to publish name and donation amount information in programs, on the website, in newsletters, marketing material and other organizational materials unless otherwise notified. Donors who do not want their name or the amount of their donation publicly disclosed may request the same from Young Texans Against Cancer.

Young Texans Against Cancer's policy is that it does not disclose, give, sell, or transfer any personal information about Young Texans Against Cancer site visitors unless required for law enforcement or otherwise required by law. We must disclose pertinent credit card information to appropriate banking institutions for those persons using credit cards to make donations to the Young Texans Against Cancer. Credit card information collected by Young Texans Against Cancer is used strictly for billing purposes.

This Privacy Policy Statement is effective as of January 1, 2011.
